This concern can be seen in the following scriptures. "But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honor; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man" (Hebrews 2:9). "I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance" (Luke 15:7).

Why should we obey the great commission? If I were limited to only one reason, I would say that we are to obey the great commission because Jesus said, "go". After all, this is reason enough. Jesus said, "if ye love me keep my commandments." Our going to heaven is dependent upon our obedience to the commandments of Christ. The great commission contains a commandment for each of us.
